

Reasons to provide your email address to your Field Technician (if you haven't already):

- 1. You can access your information (reports) from 2 to 5 days faster than waiting for the mail. You can still get your paper reports in the mail.
- 2. If we use your DHIA sample for Pregnancy, Leukosis, or Johne's testing you will see those results at least three days faster by email compared to mail. These ELISA tests are run after the fat/protein/SCC/MUN. These analyses take several hours to run and by the time results are ready, the post office is closed, so we cannot put results in the mail until the next day. Holidays and weekends make that slower yet. Currently, due to the very high volume, SpeeDee takes an average of 2 days to get samples to the lab, compared to one day last spring. You can help offset some of that lost time by using our free email service. For example, if your herd is sampled on Monday December 21, and your samples go by SpeeDee, they will be received and tested on Wednesday. You could be looking at your pregnancy results (or all of your reports) on Wednesday night in your email. We will mail those results on Thursday December 24. I wonder how long it will take to get those results in the mail? Maybe Monday December 28 at best, given Christmas on Friday followed by a weekend. Email gets those results to you at least 5 days sooner.
- 3. If you have software you will get an email that lets you know your DNL data is ready for you to retrieve.
- 4. New reports have been developed for delivery to your email and smart phone. For instance, the new SCC Flex which features the list of cows you might consider for select dry cow therapy (SDCT) will arrive by email starting this month. By February it will be available with your paper sample day reports. You probably want this list as soon as you can get your hands on it anyway, since you may have cows you plan to dry off soon after sample day. A series of new reports is on their way for winter.
- 5. We won't share your email address with anyone, just like we don't share your mailing address.

Annual Summary Update

The Minnesota DHIA Board of Directors has decided that for the calendar year 2020, due to the disruptions caused in many herds by the corona-virus, herds with 10 tests in the calendar year will be published, unless you have selected the no publicity option. This applies equally to electronic meter, robot, and traditional tests.

Winter Reminders from Jeremy Schefers DVM, PhD

As the ground freezes we hope that your crops are harvested and the fields are ready for winter. Yet, there is no rest for the weary and the seasonal work on a dairy farm is not done. Important livestock-specific tasks typically done in fall or winter include:

- 1. Calves: Add calf jackets, increase milk, and/or add supplemental fat to the milk of young calves in hutches and cold housing. Caloric and energy demand increases as temperature falls. If the ground is frozen, calves should have calf jackets and be fed more calories. Generally speaking, for every degree the temperature is below 55 F, a calf needs about 1% more milk/feed.
- 2. Deworming: Fall is an ideal time to deworm cattle and treat for both external (mange mites) and internal (stomach, intestinal) parasites. Pour-on dewormers, such as Cydectin and Eprinex, are approved for lactating cattle and are good for external and internal parasites. Please make sure to give the appropriate dose. Large Holsteins cows can weigh over 1,800 lbs. and a full pull of the treatment gun (approximately 1400 lbs) will only provide 80% of the therapeutic dose for large cows. Under-dosing will not clear the parasite burden and under-dosing is a waste of time and product. For large cows, the treatment gun can be set at 800 or 900 lbs. and pulled twice to achieve a 'killing' dose. A simple way to determine the weight of your cows is to record what cull cows weigh and compare those to herd-mates.
- 3. Proactively prevent pneumonia: If your cattle have had problems with pneumonia, consult your veterinarian and livestock professions to troubleshoot potential causes and re-examine winter ventilation. Fall is also good time to discuss treatment and vaccination protocols. Keeping calves clean and dry with ample amounts of dry bedding will reduce the severity of pneumonia.
- 4. If this is all done, there's always manure to haul, calves to dehorn and castrate, cattle to move, equipment to "winterize," and Christmas decorations to put up.

Identification (Eartag) Update

During November, Minnesota DHIA surpassed 700,000 management and RFID tags sold all time. We offer All Flex, Destron Fearing, Y-Tex and DataMars official RFID tags as well as management tags from those companies and Z Tag. Call Heidi at 763.231.6768 with questions or to place an order. One of the features of tags you purchase from DHIA is that we load those numbers into your on-farm software and your Field Technician computer so no one has to key a 15 digit number!

You may obtain free official RFID tags from Minnesota Board of Animal Health at www.bah.state.mn.us or by calling 800-627-3529. The Board of Animal Health and USDA report that the Allflex & DataMars tags are typically shipping in 2-3 weeks, and Y-Tex are taking a little longer
